## From the Minister's Desk

Hi there,

It is very good to write to you again after what has been a beautiful summer holiday. I hope you seized the occasion and enjoyed the weather. My family was able to visit Edinburgh and Newcastle-upon-Tyne to be with friends on familiar territory – a great re-union it was. As you can imagine there was so much reminiscing, laughter and banters. Our children were able to visit their old schools and play grounds. Unfortunately the school gates are still closed because of the holiday. Their hope of seeing their old friend Bush (the dog) at one of the playgrounds was dashed as well, as it was nowhere to be found. But it was a relaxing time despite all the travelling involved. But we are glad to be back now.

If you remember last month I wrote to you about Christian meditation. Did you follow up on any of the thoughts I shared? Good. But do you realise that more than us seeking after God that it is He (God) who is actually longing to be with us. Right back in Genesis 3 we read of a sense of familiarity between God and humanity, represented by Adam and Eve, when God visited them in the Garden of Eden in the cool of the evening. In due course we see God's relationship with the people of Israel as an example of the closeness God desires for all His creation. The Scripture portrays God Himself as Israel's 'husband' (Isaiah 54:1-8, 62:1-5). This same imagery is used in the New Testament to denote the relationship between Jesus Christ and the Church (Ephesians 5:21-33). In other words God desires an intimacy with us that is beyond casual acquaintances.

We see this same picture of a strong relationship from another perspective when Jesus teaches about prayer. He goes beyond the mechanics of Jewish rituals to paint the picture of a relational God, Who as our Father desires us to approach Him as such, without fear or excessive formality. Jesus begins this ageless prayer with the words 'Our Father in heaven' (Matthew 6:9f). It is not surprising then when God is depicted as the generous and merciful Father in the story of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15). I assure you that He still looking out for us today. So, I encourage you once again to seek God with all your heart. Whether it is in the cool of the evening or the quiet of the morning, or even in the cacophony of the rush hour traffic, do please find a moment in your day for God.

Anyway, for those of us with active school age children we know that the time has come again for us to hit the pavement on the familiar route to and from school. Can we then spare a moment in prayer for these families, parents and children, teachers and school administrators, as they all work to provide the right environment for knowledge to blossom? May we also pray for the quick recovery of those who are sick in our families, the church and the community.

I hope you enjoy other items of news in this edition of the newsletter. And until next month, I hope you have a wonderful time ahead. Please, remember to be part of our imminent annual Harvest. This is wishing you God's abundant blessings. Shalom!

#### **OBINTO SANITATION PROJECT**

: Some of you would probably be wondering what has happened with the Obinto Sanitation Project. So, far we have remitted all the money that we raised in instalments as the work progressed. Over the period I reported from time to time what level the work was at. The difference with jobs done at home is that folk have other

competing chores, so not much is achieved without so much pressure exerted on them. The situation is obviously compounded by the fact of one not being physically present there. However, I can report that the structural work of the women's block has now been completed, leaving the men's at foundation level. The jobs completed include the toilet block itself, and a large septic tank covered with concrete slab. My only worry is that the dimension they used for the block is so large that it measures 50feet by 12feet. Thus, it



consumed much more materials than envisaged, gulping the whole money raised in order to bring it up to the present level.
