Oh no! not evangelism!*?

On 16th March, there was a "Church Day" at Weoley Hill, addressed by Rev. Nick Stanyon, who has recently been appointed "Synod Evangelist" for the West Midlands. He gave enthusiastic, humorous and encouraging presentations on "Doing the work of an evangelist". He spent some time

demolishing some ideas of the E-word that often put people off. For instance, the E-word means "giving good news", so mournfully standing in a dirty raincoat and sandwich board proclaiming "THE END IS NIGH" is certainly not evangelism! Similarly, trying to convert people by cold-calling on the doorstep, or by forcing the name



of Jesus into a conversation may well put people off. Nevertheless, it is very useful to think again how we express our faith, so that we can talk about with confidence about it if the occasion arises. An example occurred to me while I listened to Nick. If someone said to you "What does being a Christian mean to you?", then replying: "Oh I just do it, I don't think about it" might be a missed opportunity. This does not mean that we need to *know all the answers*. It might be better if someone complained about suffering in the world, to say "Yes I find that a problem too". Also, it may well be by the quality of care for and service to others that we can best spread the good news. However, this can be supported by a carefully planned programme: Nick described a system of *asking* people in the neighbourhood what they would like the Church to pray about; in his experience, it had proved a useful means of outreach. He



also pointed out that the kind of Sunday morning worship that regular members find satisfying and worthwhile may not appeal to others – particularly if it doesn't seem both *fun* and *real*. I was reminded of the success of *Messy Church*, which is at an unconventional time and in an unconventional style for worship.

Nick finished by reminding us that churches need to *want* to grow to be successful, and recommended several courses and books, including *Evangelism for Normal People* by John Bowen and *How to explain your faith* by John Pritchard (both available very cheaply online). Ted Forgan

look for ways and funds to create a Community led initiative to head up Day Care services here at the church. With so little money available at this time it is proving quite hard to move this forward.

Whilst all this is happening we are also looking to create a Community Hub, a space to bring all sections of the community together, such as churches, schools, council services and community groups. Together we would look at services we provide, the needs of the community and where the gaps may be. Then there would be the opportunity to work
